


WELCOME TO MALTA

Marsaxlokk is an old fishing village well known for its Sunday fish market and the fresh local served dishes from a variety of restaurants. The traditional colourful boats are eye-catching as you look out into the harbour. Here, you can also find various places to swim, including St Peter's Pool.





Local Weather Report.



July is the hottest month in Malta with an average temperature of 27°C (81°F) and the coldest is January at 13°C (55°F) with the most daily sunshine hours at 12 in August.

The wettest month is November with an average of 108.6mm of <u>rain</u>.

The best month to swim in the sea is in August when the <u>average sea</u> <u>temperature</u> is 27°C (81°F).

Healthcare Facilities.



In Malta we have public and private healthcare.

The public healthcare, which is free, is provided at <u>Mater Dei</u> <u>Hospital</u>.

Private healthcare in Malta is also provided at various facilities.

Other private doctors and clinics are located throughout the island.

Malta School System.

- In Malta schools are divided into three categories: state schools, church schools and independent schools.
- State schools are accessible to all students and can be found in all the main towns or villages in Malta and Gozo. Transport to and from school is also free, as are books and other school materials. Parents will, however, need to buy their children's school uniform.
- Both church schools and <u>private</u> <u>schools</u> offer pre-primary to upper secondary education.
 Both types are regulated by the Ministry of Education.
- Some examples of church schools are <u>St Augustine</u> <u>College</u>, <u>St Michael School</u> and <u>De La Salle College</u>.

- The educational system is structured in four stages: pre-primary (ages 3 to 5), primary (ages 5 to 11), secondary (ages 11 to 18) and tertiary education. Attending school is compulsory up to the age of 16.
- You can also apply to attend the University of Malta to continue your studies in one of their many different educational programs.
